PREPARING FOR ODD SOCKS DAY

All the ideas in this pack are designed to help children and adults in a school or early years environment think about how we can reach out to prevent and stop bullying, and celebrate what makes us all unique. They could be delivered online, in smaller groups, or as a whole assembly group.

The materials are aimed at early years and Key Stage 1. This pack contains a 20 minute assembly sing along plan and lots of activity ideas to help you bring Odd Socks Day to life in your school or setting.

Delivering these materials to learners will involve careful planning. Remember that some of your learners may have experienced bullying or even be currently experiencing bullying as they take part in this Anti-Bullying Week.

Make sure you show learners:

- How to report bullying
- They can talk to you about anything they are worried about (including bullying)
- Your anti-bullying policy

Look out for the learners who you know are being bullied or for changes in behaviour of learners whilst delivering.



MAKING ODD SOCKS DAY INCLUSIVE OF ALL CHILDREN!

It is important to consider how we can make Odd Socks Day as inclusive as possible.



Make sure you:

- Consider if there are any children in your school who might not be able to wear odd socks? Some children may find changes in uniform difficult or might need a different approach. Could you ask them to wear odd socks in a different way e.g. pinned to their uniform or through a display?
- Have some pairs of socks on hand in case some children don't have odd socks on.
- Give lots of warning about holding Odd Socks Day so you can prepare for any children who may find changes difficult.











ODD SOCKS DAY FOR ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

WHAT IS IT?

Most importantly, Odd Socks Day is designed to be fun! It's an opportunity for children to express themselves and celebrate their uniqueness. There is no pressure on the children to wear the latest fashion or for parents to buy expensive costumes. All they have to do to take part is wear odd socks to school, it couldn't be simpler!



Odd Socks Day is taking place on Tuesday 12th November this year to avoid clashing with Armistice Day.



If you can't do the Tuesday of Anti-Bullying Week, any day in the week would be fine (or even the whole week!).


BEST PET IN ODD SOCKS COMPETITION

- Empower children and young people to celebrate what makes them, and others, unique and understand that it's important to choose respect.
- Help children and young people to understand how important it is that every child feels valued and included in school, able to be themselves, without fear of bullying.

RESOURCES AND PREPARATION

This could be one or two lessons depending on the length of activities undertaken.

CHOOSE



INTRODUCTION





1. Welcome and Explanation

Begin by welcoming everyone and explaining the significance of Odd Socks Day in celebrating Anti-Bullying Week.

Highlight the importance of the day by saying, "Today, we're wearing odd socks to celebrate our differences and promote kindness and respect."

2. Show off Your Odd Socks

Display slide 2. Ask everyone to proudly display their odd socks. Create an atmosphere of fun and inclusivity by encouraging laughter and admiration of each other's unique styles.



LEARNING THE SONG

1. Song Introduction

Hand out the song lyrics or display them on a screen (the chorus lyrics are on slide 3 of the PowerPoint). If time is short, focus on the lyrics as it's the catchiest part. Read through the chorus together to ensure everyone is familiar with them.



2. Dance Performance

Invite a small group of students or teachers to perform the dance moves to the chorus. This can be pre-planned or spontaneous to add excitement. The message is we are all unique and bring our own style to our dance.



3. Video Screening

Show the video (on slide 5) for 'Choose Respect' by Andy and the Odd Socks. After the video, engage the group by asking them about the message of the song. Prompt them with questions like, "What do you think the song is trying to tell us about respect?"



You could also talk about the type of music it is, how the music brought about emotions and also ask if it's their favourite style of music or not (again to show that we all are unique and have different tastes).



4. Discussion on Respect

Share the dictionary definition of respect (on slide 6): "Have due regard for (someone's feelings, wishes, or rights)."




Discuss the importance of respecting everyone in the school community, including staff, pupils, and parents.



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INTERACTIVE SEGMENT

1. Understanding Odd Socks Day

Ask the pupils why they think the Anti-Bullying Alliance holds Odd Socks Day. Discuss the message behind wearing odd socks, emphasising that it shows everyone is different but equal.

2. Group Activity

Encourage the group to list things that make us different and things that make us the same. This activity fosters awareness and appreciation of diversity.

Ask what ways it's possible to choose respect in school? Make sure some teachers have some examples to share as well.

3. Affirmation Chant

Lead everyone in a call and response for the chorus. The lead staff member/s shout or sing the lyrics of the chorus and pupils shout or sing back the elements in brackets below. This can also be found on the Odd Socks Day PowerPoint to help you on slide 8:

We're all for one (AND ONE FOR ALL)
Come together and (STAND UP TALL)
(CHOOSE RESPECT) Do you get it?
(RESPECT) Can you show it?
(RESPECT) Wanna have it?
(CHOOSE RESPECT!)

This can be turned into a fun and loud affirmation session to boost energy and solidarity.

4. Chorus Sing-Along

Have a final sing along and free flow dance to the song. This collective activity reinforces the message and creates a sense of unity.

CONCLUSION

1. School Initiatives

Share what else the school is doing for Anti-Bullying Week, such as lessons and fun activities. Provide details about the school's anti-bullying policy and how to report bullying.



2. Final Remarks

Emphasise the importance of supporting each other and respecting everyone's differences.

Encourage students to be proactive in creating a respectful and inclusive environment every day.

3. Closing

Thank everyone for participating and remind them of the importance of Odd Socks Day in promoting respect and kindness.











OTHER ODD SOCKS DAY ACTIVITY IDEAS



Create an Odd Socks photo, GIF or video. In 2023 we saw some amazingly creative ways of displaying odd socks. You could create your own videos or images of you all in your odd socks. Whether it's just a photo of your feet or a whole assembly photo in odd socks, there are endless ways to get creative!



Odd Socks Sock Puppet Show! Script and perform your own sock puppet show. Using the themes we have been discussing for Anti-Bullying Week, write your own short script and perform using sock puppets of your own creation. If you are feeling super confident, you could freestyle the show and make up the story as you go along.



Puppet Band! Make your own Andy and the Odd Socks sock puppet band and film them miming along to the lyrics of **'Choose Respect'.** Share your videos on your school's social media platforms or website using the hashtags **#AntiBullyingWeek #OddSocksDay**



Design your own odd sock! Make the design unique to you using your favourite colours, symbols or patterns. You could work with a partner and do an odd sock swap so they have one of yours and you have one of theirs! Odd socks rule!



Odd Socks bunting: They could also put their name on their odd socks. These could be displayed on string as Odd Socks bunting around the school or children could make it to display in their homes!



Music themed: Ask learners to each identify their favourite song and then share in small groups. If the songs are different, ask them to find out what the songs share. For example, do they have the same time signature, tempo, similar instruments etc. This shows we can all be different and the same at the same time.



You could put on a 'Choose Respect' show, where either learners or staff perform the song for an audience of learners, parents, and/or staff. Andy would love to see your videos!



Create your own odd socks 'tag' video: We want to show just how many children and adults are taking part in Odd Socks Day this year! Post a video of you, your teachers or children (with relevant permissions) saying 'We've got our odd socks on to stop bullying' and showing us your amazing socks! Don't forget to tag us and use the hashtag #OddSocksDay.
